## Key achievements to date:

- Achieved the School Games Gold Award for 2023/24
- Continued to increase participation in inter-school sporting events/opportunities and developed links within our wider community. Both engaged and disengaged children were targeted.
- Increased the number of links within our community to allow the children to increase participation in sport around the Darlington area.
- Attended 28 inter-school events in 2023/24. 76% of Year 4,5 and 6 children have participated.
- Completed 13 intra-school events in 2023/24.
- 1007 Participations in our intra-school events this year. 486 boys, 521 girls and 94 SEND.
- Increased knowledge and confidence levels through CPD for newer members of the Abbey School staff to ensure high quality PE is delivered throughout school.
- Y6 sports leaders run morning, break and lunch clubs.
- Sports Leaders fully involved in after school clubs and running of KS1 clubs.
- Junior Sports Leaders used to run sports day.
- Coaches used to support staff CPD support with planning and lesson delivery
- EY physical development sessions introduced
- Offered a range of activities during mornings, break/lunchtimes and afterschool so children are active for 60 minutes per day.
- A Successful Deep Dive report in PE from GoWell.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- To further develop Y6 sports leaders to support to run intra school competitions
- Embed PE assessment— to ensure that targeted children can make accelerated progress
- Ensure all children are active for 60 minutes each day
- Encourage less-active children to become more active
- To further develop coaching and support from sports coach
- Lunchtime supervisors to receive further training from sports lead to encourage more children to be active during lunchtimes
- Improved participation in inclusive competitions
